Thank you for your email dated April 14, 2006. I am responding on behalf of Daryl Coulson and all Staff at the Pembroke District Office of the Ministry of Natural Resources.

As identified in your email, I understand that you have some concerns with a potential proposed aggregate quarry expansion in the Township of McNab/Braeside.

To date the Ministry of Natural Resources has not received an application for a quarry expansion. Although I have heard people talking about an application I have not been given a date as to when one might be expected.

Please find below an outline of the process for an applicant to apply for a licence and the public notification process. This information was also provided to another concerned resident by our Minister.

The Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) administers the *Aggregate Resources Act* (ARA) in all townships designated under the Act. As the Village of Braeside and the Township of McNab are regulated under the ARA, Miller Paving will be required to apply for an aggregate licence prior to operating a quarry. The Aggregate Resources of Ontario Provincial Standards (section 7 of Ontario Regulation 244/97) specifies standards that must be met as part of the application.

Once the application including various studies have been completed, there is a 45 day notification and consultation process in which various agencies such as the Township, County, Ministry of Environment, Ministry of Natural Resources and the public have an opportunity to comment and voice concerns.

As a member of the public you will have an opportunity to provide your concerns under the *Aggregate Resources Act* and the Environmental Bill of Rights once the applicant has applied to the MNR.

If an application is submitted to the MNR a sign will be posted at the entrance to the quarry identifying where documents pertaining to the expansion may be reviewed as well as the date and time of the public information session that will be hosted by the applicant. In addition to this there will be public notice in a local newspaper and notification to all landowners who live within 120m of the proposed expansion boundaries.
